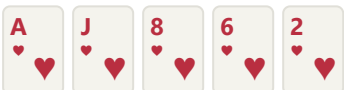
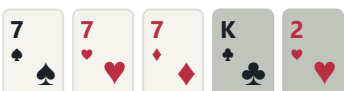
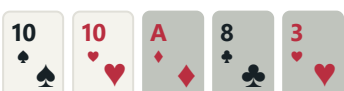


Poker hand rankings

Texas Hold'em · From strongest to weakest

01	Royal flush		Ten through Ace, all of the same suit. Unbeatable. Players who share it also share the pot.
02	Straight flush		Five consecutive cards of the same suit. Compare the highest card in each straight flush.
03	Four of a kind		Four cards of the same rank. Compare the four matching cards, then the fifth card if needed.
04	Full house		Three of a kind plus a pair. Compare the three of a kind first, then the pair.
05	Flush		Five cards of the same suit, not in sequence. Compare all five ranks, from highest to lowest.
06	Straight		Five consecutive ranks in more than one suit. The highest card in the straight decides the winner.
07	Three of a kind		Three cards of the same rank. Compare the three matching cards, then the two remaining cards in order.
08	Two pair		Two pairs of different ranks. Compare the higher pair, the lower pair, then the fifth card, in that order.
09	One pair		Two cards of the same rank. Compare the pair, then the other three cards in order.
10	High card		None of the combinations above. Compare the cards one by one, from highest to lowest.

Always 5 cards. Flush > straight. Full house > flush. A-2-3-4-5 is a five-high straight. All suits are equal. Five identical ranks = split pot.

A = Ace · K = King · Q = Queen · J = Jack. A royal flush is an Ace-high straight flush.
